## **Automated Job Importing to MilitaryHire.com**

As part of premium membership levels, MilitaryHire (MH) offers the ability for our customers to bulk import their jobs into our system, via a structured XML jobs url provided to us, unique to each customer. This document will serve as a high level overview of our process, and baseline file standards.

## **Process**

Upon completion of new account signup, and successful account verification / payment at a qualifying membership level, MH will begin the job import setup:

- An initial joint call to overview the process and answer any questions you may have. We
  recommend sharing this document with your development team ahead of time and
  inviting this to this call so they have an opportunity to ask any clarifying questions.
- Once the technical process is understood, your development team works to create your
  job import feed. Please keep in mind that your production job feed url is required to
  start the process on our end.
- Once we have your production job feed, we will begin the process of integrating into our system. Generally we find there are at least a couple data-related questions that need clarified or potentially updated in the actual job feed. Efficient and timely responses from your development team help speed this process along.
- Once all data issues have been cleared, the feed is programmed into our nightly import
  process. We are an agile development environment, and operate on two week sprints
  currently. To allow for sufficient development and QA time, our target is 1 month from
  receipt of your production XML feed to implementation on our site. Changes in job feed
  url or structure, or significant issues/changes to content of the job feed may impact this
  timeline.

## File Standards

We currently only accept bulk job import data in XML format. Our recommended format is attached as Appendix A. Deviations from this template, especially additional data fields, may result in longer analysis and implementation timeframes.
